From Pastor Amy



The new year is almost upon us. It's a time when we reflect on the past year – the blessings we've received, the sorrows we've experienced, the difficulties we've faced. It's also a time of looking forward into the new year and wonder-

ing what God has in store for us. What does 2024 hold for us?

We don't know what the new year holds for any of us and that can bring a certain level of anxiety. As I think about this, I remember the Scripture I shared with you back in the September Perspective – "Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9) These words are so important as we head into the new year. Whatever 2024 holds for us - the good and the difficult - we will not be alone. Jesus, himself, promised, "I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20) We can face whatever circumstances and situations we encounter with the reassurance that Jesus is with us. He is our Rock, our Refuge and Strength. Staff News

As the council prepared the 2024 budget for approval by the congregation at the annual meeting, about \$50,000-\$60,000 needed to be cut from budget requests. Some staff hours were reduced and the position of Communications Specialist was removed from the 2024 budget.

We thank Cheryl Hentz for being our Communications Specialist for the past 1½ years. Cheryl has been a great member of the staff and has kept us all "in the loop" with church news through Luther Lines, *Perspective*, our website, Facebook, and other forms of communication. Thank you, Cheryl!

We are now accepting applications for the position of Parish Administrative Assistant. This position is 24 hours per week.

This highly visible position will assist with the day-to-day operation of the church including worship related activities, office duties, and ministry support.

Key responsibilities include preparing weekly worship service materials; maintaining the church calendar and schedule events; maintain church database and records; answer the phone; greet visitors and members in the office; vendor relations; produce and email weekly and monthly newsletters; report generation; and volunteer coordination.

The successful candidate will possess 3-5 years as an administrative assistant with a strong knowledge of Microsoft Office Suite and desktop publishing. Experience with social media and websites is helpful. Good communication skills (both written and verbal); strong organizational skills; self-starter with ability to act independently; and ability to process highly confidential information and handle finances are traits we are seeking.

"Living Lutheran" Magazine Ceases Print Edition

As noted in the March issue of Living Lutheran magazine, the magazine will cease its print publication with the November/December 2023 issue. When the print magazine ends, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America will continue to share stories of the church. However, the ELCA will transition to a fully online approach, employing videos, audio stories, and more. This transition will also include a more robust social media presence and opportunities for user-generated content with the potential for greater engagement from readers.

When the shift to an all-digital platform occurs (at no cost to you and with no login required), there are several ways to keep up with the stories the ELCA publishes. Sign up for LLStories, a free email digest, and get Living Lutheran stories sent right to your inbox every week. Select the categories that interest you, and opt to get the digest weekly, every other week, or monthly. On Facebook and Instagram, you can also follow the magazine **@LivingLutheran** to stay apprised of the stories the ELCA is telling every day.

Throughout the past several years, LivingLutheran.org has been the magazine's online platform. Storytelling will remain at the core of this work, but this online content and new channels for distribution will give the ELCA more flexibility and options for telling the stories of this church. Please see the November/December print issue's feature story about the print magazine called "A Legacy of Lutheran Storytelling," which chronicles the history of the ELCA as covered by the magazine. On the back page, there is also a short note to readers about this shift in publication.
